

Youth to Benefit from Seven Day Cycle

One hundred and thirteen riders, from as far away as Canberra and Queensland, set out from Hornsby TAFE College on Saturday April 1st to embark upon the 8th Annual Sydney to Surfers cycle tour fundraiser.

Organised by the Engadine Rotary Club, riders were required to cover between 120 to 160 kilometres a day in order to complete the 950 kilometre tour on schedule by Friday April 7th.

Hannanprint NSW employee John Hardy took part in the tour for the second time.

All proceeds from the fundraising efforts are directed toward the major beneficiary, Youth off the Streets. This organisation supports chronically homeless and drug addicted young Australians as they work to turn their lives around. Youth off the Streets' goal is for these young people to leave their care drug free, with a high school education, living skills and a full or part time job in hand.

Hannanprint NSW staff contributed over \$250 in raffle ticket sales which was put toward the total amount raised of \$111,060.
